

PERMIT CONDITIONS

This permit authorizes the importation of the listed articles, under the conditions specified below. A copy of this permit (including all conditions) must accompany all shipments authorized under this permit. Upon arrival in the United States, the articles and shipping container(s) are subject to inspection by officials of Customs and Border Protection, Agriculture Inspection (CBP-AI) and Plant Protection and Quarantine (PPQ).

1. Bolivia-Brazil-Chile-Costa Rica-Ecuador-Guatemala-Mexico-Nicaragua-Peru

Allium spp. (All plant parts)

2. Permit holder's legal responsibility:

A) Any person who violates the Plant Protection Act (PPA) of the United States, individuals or corporations who fail to comply with these conditions and authorizations, or who forge, counterfeit, or deface permits may be criminally or administratively prosecuted and found guilty of a misdemeanor which can result in penalties, a one-year prison term, or both. Additionally, any person violating the PPA may be assessed civil penalties of up to \$250,000 per violation or twice the gross gain or gross loss for a violation that results in the person deriving pecuniary gain or a pecuniary loss to another, whichever is greater. In addition, all current permits may be cancelled and future permit applications denied.

B) Any person who unloads, lands, or otherwise brings or moves into and through the United States any regulated plants, plant products, plant pests, soil or other products or articles in violations of the regulations will be subject to prosecution under the applicable provisions of the law.

C) CBP-AI and PPQ have the option to order the least drastic action, which could be approve treatment, re-exportation or destruction of a shipment, a portion of a shipment, or any other material associated with the shipment (i.e. pallets, packaging, means of conveyance...). This will be done if the official personnel find that the shipment requires treatment as a condition of entry, is contaminated with a quarantine plant pest or pests, is commingled with a prohibited plant material, or if required documentation is incomplete or missing. Noncompliant shipments will be treated, re-exported or destroyed, at the consignee's expense.

D) All costs and arrangements for the safeguarding of the cargo and transportation of the cargo are the responsibility of the importer, broker, or other parties associated with the shipment.

E) If fumigation is required and "Plastic wrappings such as cellophane, films, and shrink wrap, and papers that are waxed, laminated, or waterproofed are not readily permeable and must be perforated, removed, or opened before fumigation. If wrappings are perforated to facilitate fumigation, holes should be at least 3/16-inch in diameter every 3 square inches or 1/4-inch in diameter every 4 inches over the entire surface of the wrapping."

F) All wood packing material (WPM) present with this shipment must meet the requirements of the importing and destination country and is subject to ISPM 15 treatment and IPPC stamp requirements and enforcement.

G) Shipments placed on hold by CBP-AI may not be moved or released from the Port of Entry without authorization by CBP-AI.
